

Legislators listen to how Governor Bryant plans to deal with red tide issues: Tallahassee, Florida

The following photograph from April 11, 1963 shows Governor Bryant addressing a group of legislatures. The 21 legislatures are arranged in three rows, the first two seated, the third standing with the Governor just in front of them leaning on a rail. They appear to be in the gallery of a meeting room. These legislators from seven counties concerned about the Red Tide outbreak hear Gov. Farris Bryant tell them about the appointment of a citizen's committee to serve as a liaison group between the people and the State Conservation Department and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Bryant appointed one person from each county and he also coordinated his effort with the legislators. Legislators shown above represent following counties: Charlotte; Collier; Hillsborough; Lee; Manatee; Sarasota; and Pinellas.
