



Pinellas County Childhood Lead Screening Map

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The Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, housed at the Florida Department of Health headquarters in Tallahassee, was established in 1992 through a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The program maintains a statewide blood lead surveillance system and coordinates with federal, state and local partners to develop and implement strategies to eliminate childhood lead poisoning in Florida. The program also provides case management to children with elevated blood lead levels, educates the public and professionals about lead screening and lead poisoning prevention, and works to develop state and local policies that protect children at risk for lead poisoning.

Lead-based paint, commonly found in homes built before 1978, is still the most significant source of lead exposure for children. This map displays shaded areas that exceed the national average for pre-1950 or pre-1970 housing. Children ages 1 and 2 living in the shaded areas should be screened. Children between the age of 2 and 6 who were not screened at 1 and 2 should also be screened.
